Study Leave

We believe that when all our pupils are in our school, and are in class with their teachers, then we create a fairer and more equitable system that improves the outcomes for all pupils, not just for some.

From week beginning Monday 30 April, pupils will be involved in a two-week catch up/revision timetable. All pupils remain in school, following their timetable through to and including Friday 11 May.

Course work will have been finalised and pupils will remain in classes to be supported by their teachers. Where units are still to be completed class teachers can focus on supporting their pupils through these. Pupils doing N4, or those at risk of failing the N5 external assessment can have time to sit their N4 AVU where appropriate. It would be appropriate for pupils to study for other subjects at this time if/when required.

Where a pupil has an external examination, they will be given three days at home prior to the exam in order to work at home to revise for the exam. Classes will however run as normal and they would be permitted to attend the class for the subject area to revise and seek advice from the class teacher. This would however be optional for the pupil.

From Monday 14 May to Friday 1 June, pupils who have had more than 3 external examinations will be permitted study leave but will also have the option of opting in to Meaningful May activities. Those without external examinations will participate in a Meaningful May project.

From Monday 4 June, the new timetable will begin and all pupils will return to their new classes.
